#### V. <u>CHANCELLOR'S UPDATES</u>

Thanks to everyone who helps to keep City Colleges safe during the pandemic. CCC has decided to continue wearing masks.

Let's take a moment to express solidarity with those fighting courageously for freedom in Ukraine. We want to remind our students faculty and staff that our wellness centers

are available to support those impacted by war and violence.

CCC announced the launch of Project Safe last week. It is a project focused on gender-based violence. Every enrolled student will receive basic Violence Prevention education in their first year with a special focus on gender-based violence. Faculty and staff will be trained on how to support student survivors and offer resources in a trauma-informed way. This will improve our support for those facing trauma. Thank you, Vice Chancellor Stephanie Krah and the team for your efforts.

Today, CSO Veronica Herrero, Provost Potter, and the Olive Harvey team will speak to key efforts underway in the first level of our strategic plan for student tiering in math and English.

The board will consider a revised telework policy today. We are expanding our telework to include tutors and librarians to offer our busy students more options for service including early mornings, evenings, and weekends.

I want us to recognize our Executive Director of the Office of Student Transitions Shelly Lemons for being the recipient of the 2022 National Institute for the Study of Transfer Students Transfer Champion. Shelly has spent 10 years at City Colleges of Chicago creating transfer partnerships.

CCC has been selected under a new partnership with Amazon as an educational partner for Amazon's career choice part program providing Amazon's hourly employee's access to education. The educational benefit includes full college tuition for those employees who come to city colleges of Chicago.
