V. <u>CHANCELLOR'S REMARKS</u>

Chancellor began by thanking Student Trustee Tiri-Xi'ui and all of the other student leaders and student government.

This past weekend we reached a tentative agreement with the Cook County Teachers Union Local 1600 representing our full-time faculty and professionals. We recognize the bargaining teams that represented the City Colleges of Chicago.

City Colleges is outperforming both state and national averages this fall with a year over year enrollment increase of 6.9% according to the Illinois Community College Board.

Today, we will hear from Vice Chancellor of Marketing & Institutional Branding David Deyhle on our efforts in marketing and branding.

The State of Illinois has released capital dollars that were designated to us that will allow us to address some essential upgrades in deferred maintenance across all the colleges.

As we heard in the Committee meeting earlier today, Olive Harvey has developed a partnership with the Chicago Police Department for a one-year accelerated Criminal Justice AAS program that leads directly to placement with the Chicago Police Department.

CCC will also now offer a Two Plus Two transfer agreement with Northern Illinois University in Sports Management and Kinesiology.

Another partnership considered today will be with Aspen Institute to provide our entire CCC leadership team with professional development informed by Aspen's extensive research into Community College best practices.
