The goal of these programs is to provide resources and access to short-term training certifications, work-based learning experiences and apprenticeships that will enable up to 3,614 Chicago residents from September 1, 2022 through December 31, 2024 to earn an average hourly rate of \$15-\$30 during their on-the-job training experiences that will in-turn prepare participants to obtain employment sooner while putting them on a path to earn increased sustainable wages long term.
