Summary

Malcolm X is seeking funding from the Department of Labor to support a Nurse Education Professional Track to train participants to become nursing instructors and educators. Working closely with two health care system partners— University of Chicago Medicine and Sinai Chicago—and labor partners IL Chapter, American Nurses Association; IL Chapter, Haitian Alliance Nursing Association; and Philippine Nurses Association of IL–we will recruit nurses (ADN, RN, BSN, MSN) with two years of work experience and provide training for them to become nurse educators. We expect to have increased capacity to support nurse educators with adjunct employment because we will be staffing not only our current MXC needs, but also an additional location at CCC's Kennedy-King College. Nurse educators who successfully complete training will be offered adjunct faculty positions at Malcolm X College. Projections are that these 120 educators can train between 12,160-24,000 nursing assistants and nurses over five years.

that the Board of Trustees approves acceptance of any gifts, grants or other funding which may be forthcoming from these proposals and authorizes the Chancellor, the Chief of Staff and Strategy, the Vice Chancellor of Institutional Advancement, or Associate Vice Chancellor of Institutional Resource Development to serve as authorized representative or official representative of the District in the submission of proposals for funding and to execute all documents for the acceptance of this funding or these gifts and the operation of the funded projects; said acceptance to be subject to the terms and conditions set forth by the grantor, including specified subcontracts and purchases, and said funds not to be expended by the Board for any other purposes.
