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This funding opportunity is part of the FY23 Omnibus Appropriations Bill which includes federal funding for congressional directed spending. These funds will be used to launch a Task Force and pilot program for Open Educational Resources (OER) at Harold Washington College. The primary goals of the Task Force through the grant project will be to reduce the annual costs for textbooks and educational materials while maintaining through assessment activities the quality and achievement of learning objectives for the large number of students in first-year courses. This proposal will reduce the cost of education to students and also to increase accessibility of education resources to our students. These funds have been earmarked through the Office of Senator Dick Durbin.

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This funding opportunity will help build strategic pathways including Early College courses, City Colleges of Chicago Associate degrees, and CPS students. Additionally, it will be used to hire three Early College Navigators to support CPS student enrollment in early college courses. The navigators will work with parents and families to ensure comprehension of opportunities for students and career resources. The Vivo Build Grant will support the Chicago Roadmap mission through its collaboration with Chicago Public Schools and four-year partners.

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This is a continuation grant for District. Perkins V facilitates this by placing a greater emphasis on the following areas: local flexibility; comprehensive stakeholder engagement and collaborative planning; innovation; equity and accountability; and alignment with other education and workforce programs. The colleges will use funds to plan activities within a few or all of 10 ICCB Expenditure Account Categories; Personnel, Fringe Benefits, Travel, Equipment, Supplies, Contractual Services, Consultants, Training & Education, Other, and General Admin as they address the outlined objectives for the (6) CTE Perkins V Elements.

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This funding opportunity will support the execution, development, implementation and delivery of CTE programming at West Side Learning Center (WSLC) at Malcolm X College (MXC). The funding allowed us to address student needs (by allowing the Workforce Equity Initiative to provide unfettered funding for short term programs at WSLC at MXC) and by addressing funding for the existing CTE programs at WSLC. These efforts have increased CTE enrollments at WSLC and increased the presence and reputation of MXC in the community. However, the outdated infrastructure at WSLC has served as a barrier as well as an impetus for students to withdraw or refuse to enroll. These results underscore the need for our project to renovate and expand WSLC to dynamically improve the infrastructure, increase Malcolm X College’s capacity at WSLC and address the issues of unemployment and education attainment in communities that have been historically under-resourced and underserved.
