**Summary**

During the 48-month funding period, CCC intends to scale its partnership with One Millions Degrees (OMD) to serve six community colleges, reaching a total of 5,000 per year by the conclusion of the awarded timeframe. CCC and OMD will provide comprehensive, integrated services for academic support, personal coaching, financial support, and professional development, and scholarships to eligible students to incentivize their full participation. The outcomes of the project are to continue the embedding of OMD services campuswide at six of the community colleges, improve baseline outcomes for enrollment rates, OMD program participation, expand student support, increase persistence, credit accumulation, and improve completion rates.

### Summary

Wilbur Wright College proposes an Early Phase project in collaboration with Northeastern Illinois University (NEIU) to strengthen postsecondary success for Hispanic students in academic transfer programs for business and information technology degrees. The proposed 'Un Modelo Mejor' program will provide holistic student supports, mirror the curriculum of the transfer receiving institution at the community college-level, foster a sense of belonging and self-efficacy for students, and create intentional Communities of Practice (CoP) for Business & Tech students. Wright College and NEIU will coordinate on 1) curriculum revision/alignment, 2) recruitment/access/onboarding, 3) comprehensive financial wellness and support, 4) advising with subject matter expertise, 5) students' self-efficacy and sense of belonging, and 6) measuring progress and challenges in accordance with What Works Clearinghouse Standards. Over the course of four years, Wright College estimates that at least 175 full-time students in Business & Tech transfer programs will be directly served, tracked and assessed under 'Un Modelo Mejor.'
