South Side Expansion Plan Highlights

Englewood

- City Colleges will develop a full nursing pathway at Kennedy-King College's Englewood Campus.
- Basic Nursing Assistant program operated by Kennedy-King College at KKC will serve as feeder for the South Side nursing location in Englewood.
- MXC will operate an associate degree in nursing program at Kennedy-King's Englewood Campus.

Washington Park

 MXC will open a new facility providing health science education at a Washington Park campus adjacent to new Pathology Labs to be built by University of Chicago Medical Center (see next slide for details)

Opportunities

- Returns full nursing pathway to the college (KKC) and Englewood community.
- Expands the **geographic reach** of healthcare programs to students on the South Side.
- Consistent high-quality nursing and health care programs provided by Malcolm X College.
- Strong UChicago relationship with Malcolm X College.
 - Builds upon City Colleges MOU with UChicago.
 - Commitment to clinicals and hiring from UChicago.
- Increase enrollment at both KKC and MXC.



Phase One of the Kennedy-King Expansion Began this Past Fall

- Phase One includes construction for Basic Nursing Assistant program of:
 - Student classrooms
 - Labs
- Estimated cost: \$725,000 approx.
- Timeline:
 - Construction start: Fall 2023
 - Announced: Spring 2024
 - Classes begin: Fall 2024



Shottees Melton of Auburn Gresham earned her BNA at Malcolm X for free through Project MPACT. She launched her career at a nursing home and a hospital. She is planning to pursue her LPN licensure.

Phase Two of the Kennedy-King Expansion Will Begin in 2024

- Proposed Phase Two would include construction of state of the art:
 - Student classrooms
 - Simulated hospital suite(s)
 - Observation rooms (adjoining the simulation suites)
 - Mock reception/nursing station
 - Quiet study spaces
 - Collaborative study areas
 - Staff work areas, conference rooms
- **Estimated cost:** \$8-\$10 million (\$5 million secured to date).
- Approximate timeline:
 - Design + Engineering: 2024 -- 2025
 - Construction: 2025 2026
 - Opening: 2027





UChicago Medicine Clinical Labs

Specialized medical laboratory facility built on land owned by the University of Chicago


- Consolidate existing UChicago Medicine pathology labs into one location and modernize lab operations
- Maximize lab test efficiency to ensure best in class care
- Meet increased need for testing stemming from planned Cancer Pavilion coming online in 2027
- Provide clinical rotations for Malcolm X students and immediate job opportunities to Malcolm X graduates

Preliminary Site Concept



New learning center for Malcolm X College including classrooms, dry labs, office space, and ground-floor retail space built on land owned by Chicago Transit Authority


Includes parking structure for students and employees of UChicago Medicine and Malcolm X


