I am very pleased to see everyone. Thank you, President Webb Walker, for hosting our meeting today and for that wonderful lunch. We feel very spoiled. As we begin the month of October, I hope that everyone is looking forward to The Fall season. October is the start of breast cancer awareness month. ### V. <u>CHANCELLORS UPDATE</u>

Chancellor Salgado began by thanking President Webb Walker for hosting today's meeting, and asked her to say a few words about Kennedy King.

This is women in AI month. Chancellor Salgado just returned from sharing work in AI with leaders from around the country at the AWS Summit. It was clear from the visit that significant strides are being made in the tech space.

AI is just one of the many high-demand programs that we are intentionally looking to grow to help put our students on the path to upward mobility.

Just this morning, we announced the launch of a new School of Engineering and an expanded Engineering Access Alliance partnership with top-ranked University of Illinois, Urbana-Champaign's Grainger College of Engineering. Together, we will create the nation's premier community college pathway to an engineering degree.

We are very proud of this program, and the work of our team led by Dr. Doris Espiritu and our students. This program is helping to change the face of engineering in Illinois. It has grown from about 25 students when I started at City Colleges to more than 600 students today.

In a few minutes, we will hear from Provost Potter and Dr. Espiritu about how we will build upon this model to prepare more Chicagoans for successful engineering careers.

Earlier this week, Wright College was recertified for the Seal of Excelencia, a recognition that the college goes far beyond enrollment in its support of students, including Latine students. The engineering program is a big part of why Wright received this recognition.

Also earlier this week, Governor Pritzker visited Daley College to mark the launch of the Make It In Illinois manufacturing marketing campaign. Congratulations to President Janosky and Dean Girzadas for Daley College being chosen as a leading partner in the state-wide effort to raise awareness of education and employment opportunities in the manufacturing field.

On the heels of a successful College Fair at the Chicago Football Classic. We want to recognize the team, the president, and the trustees that attended. We recently reached our census enrollment date, after which we submit data to ICCB. We expect to have the fall ICCB enrollment report back from the state in the coming weeks. I am pleased to note that our preliminary data shows that we are up again this fall for both credit and adult education students. Great job to the many involved in our enrollment, student services, and marketing efforts. Again, we will have a lot more to share on enrollment next month.

As we move into the second half of Hispanic Heritage Month, the Hispanic Association of Colleges and Universities announced the second cohort of its Enlace Mid-Level Leadership Program, and two City Colleges of Chicago employees were named to the list. Tatiana M. Gallegos, director of manufacturing grants at Richard J. Daley College, and Natalie Morales, testing coordinator at Wilbur Wright College. Natalie and Tatiana

will join 52 other leaders at Hispanic-Serving Institutions across the country for this opportunity.

Congratulations also goes to David Ramirez, City College's student trustee, who was recently selected for another leadership role. This year, David will serve as chair of the Illinois Community College Board (ICCB)'s Student Advisory Committee (SCA).

It's election season. In a timely announcement, the ALL IN Campus Democracy Challenge (ALL IN) recognized Harold Washington College, Harry S. Truman College, Kennedy King College, Olive Harvey College, and Richard J. Daley College for nonpartisan democratic engagement efforts that fostered high levels of student voter engagement in the 2022 midterm elections. Each college received the Bronze Seal, reflecting a commitment to ensuring that nonpartisan democratic engagement is a defining feature of campus life.

Daley College additionally earned the honor of 2022 Chicago Campus Voting Challenge's Highest Voting Rate for Community Colleges while Olive Harvey College earned the Chicago Campus Highest Voter Registration Rate for community colleges.

City Colleges continues to be recognized nationally for our work, from engineering to voter engagement to student support. I want to commend everyone for their hard work on behalf of our students.
