V. <u>CHANCELLORS UPDATE</u>

It is August and officially "Back to School Month". City College students will begin classes as early as August 22nd. Our colleges are in the thick of registration. Please be mindful that peak registration is underway and lend a hand if you can. During today's committee meeting, we had a presentation from VC of High School Partnerships, Peggy Korellis, and the Chicago Roadmap Team. The roadmap is our nationally recognized model for K-12 – community partnership with the Chicago Public Schools. I am so proud of the tremendous work being done through the Roadmap program across all levels of our organization. It is marvelous to see how our faculty and staff are collaborating with their CPS counterparts which is key to making this relationship successful.

There were numerous highlights the team shared during the presentation.

HIGHLIGHTS

- Through our transitional English courses, we have increased those students who are eligible for college-level English by 13 percentage points and by 19 percentage points for Black students.
- Through our transitional math courses, we increased the CPS students eligible for college-level math by 16 percentage points, and by 22 percentage points for Black students.
- In both cases our transitional students are retaining at higher rates than students placed in developmental education with fall to fall retention up 12 percent for transitional English students and up 25 percent for transitional math students.
- We also continue to see our early college students grow. The number of CPS students taking free dual enrollment or dual credit courses for college credit while in high school is up 22 percent year over year.

This work is truly making an impact on students' lives.

We began the week with some other fantastic news.

CFO Rodriguez informed us that Fitch Ratings increased the rating on our G-O bonds from A+ TO AA- with a stable outlook. This increase is a reflection on our successful work to eliminate a structural deficit, return to strong cash reserves, and increase enrollment bolstered by our in-demand educational programs and critical student supports.

We have had great strides in partnerships this summer.

Chancellor Salgado had the opportunity to represent City Colleges at the Governor and Mayor's announcement last Thursday about making Chicago and Illinois a leader in quantum technology. City Colleges has been chosen by the state to play an important role as a workforce development partner in quantum.
