**STOP LOSS INSURANCE PLAN**  
**BLUE CROSS BLUE SHIELD OF ILLINOIS**

**THE CHANCELLOR RECOMMENDS:**

that the Board of Trustees authorizes the Chair, upon final approval of the General Counsel of the legal form of such agreement, to execute an agreement with Health Care Service Corporation, a Mutual Legal Reserve Company, d/b/a Blue Cross Blue Shield of Illinois (“BCBS”) for BCBS to provide Individual Specific Deductible Stop Loss Insurance for all BCBSIL PPO Medical Claims for the period commencing January 1, 2026 through December 31, 2026 at a total cost not to exceed \$2,800,000.00.

**USERS:**

All Eligible Employees, Retirees, and their Dependents enrolled in BCBS PPO medical plan.

**TERM:**

The term of this agreement shall commence January 1, 2026, and continue through December 31, 2026, with options to extend for two additional one (1) year periods.

**SCOPE OF SERVICES:**

Stop-loss medical insurance coverage allows CCC to safeguard from excessive or unpredictable claim costs. Under this policy, BCBS would reimburse CCC when individual claims exceed the agreed upon \$250,000 threshold.

This structure ensures financial protection and budget predictability for CCC while maintaining comprehensive healthcare benefits for employees, retirees, and their dependents. It also allows CCC to continue managing its self-funded plan responsibly while limiting exposure to high-cost medical events.

**BENEFIT TO CITY COLLEGES OF CHICAGO:**

The vendor as both the plan administrator and stop-loss carrier, Blue Cross Blue Shield of Illinois offers a fully integrated approach that enhances claims accuracy, reduces administrative

redundancy, and ensures timely financial protection against catastrophic losses. This alignment provides the City Colleges of Chicago with greater cost efficiency, data transparency, and risk control than would be achieved through a separate stop-loss provider. Stop Loss Insurance provides an added layer of insurance protection against catastrophic claims and unpredictable losses.

**VENDOR SELECTION CRITERIA:**

The contract is being utilized as part of the joint purchasing agreement that has been advertised and was awarded in July 2020 in accordance with the joint procurement procedures of CCC, other sister City agencies and the City of Chicago (Specification No. CBO 2019-001). This agreement (Contract #233859 and PO #6078) has been extended through the City of Chicago as part of our joint procurement agreement.

Ethics – It shall be the duty of each party to the agreement to comply with the applicable provisions of the Board's Ethics Policy adopted January 7, 1993, and as amended by the Board.

Contingent Liability – Pursuant to Section 7-14 of the Illinois Public Community College Act, all agreements authorized herein shall contain a clause that any expenditure beyond the current fiscal year is subject to appropriation in the subsequent fiscal year.
