Support from Microsoft will enable CCC to address these barriers by providing resources to ensure students gain the AI skills needed to excel at the workplace or in school. Funding will include support for personnel, student support, and supply costs. A minimum of 300 students will benefit from the Generative AI Skill Development and Credentialing Pilot.
