This continuation grant funding for Survivor Advocacy Services, which provides direct victim services to violence-impacted students across the district, thereby increasing the support framework for helping students overcome one of the most significant barriers to education. City Colleges of Chicago students are disproportionately impacted by violent crimes when compared to other institutions of higher education in and outside of Chicago. Crime, violence, and trauma directly impact student retention, student wellness, and academic achievement. This program will also increase CCC's response to the lived experienced of the communities we serve and put City Colleges at the frontline of violence prevention work in the City.

This new award aims to address homelessness and housing insecurity among college students, with a focus on ensuring equitable access to education. This grant will support services that stabilize students' housing situations, provide emergency assistance, and enhance students' ability to persist in their education despite financial or housing challenges. Wright College's initiatives will address the immediate needs of students experiencing homelessness or housing insecurity. Including, providing short-term emergency assistance (e.g., temporary housing vouchers, grocery gift cards), connecting students with community housing resources, and offering educational workshops on financial literacy and sustainable housing solutions. The program will also include a case management component to guide students through accessing local services and navigating systemic barriers.

This update is to communicate the approval of one subrecipient partner identified to support the program objectives and expected grant deliverables. The college is allocating the following: Public Health Institute of Metropolitan Chicago (PHIMC), who will receive \$160,000 subaward, will partner with MXC to develop and disseminate information about the program, advocate the value of trained paraprofessionals in supporting family/children's needs, and conduct outreach to share the program's successes. PHIMC will recruit apprenticeship partners and support placements. For this project's purpose, PHIMC will provide services that benefit impacted families and youth, including reducing and/or preventing prescription drug and opioid overuse. Finally, PHIMC will provide an Apprenticeship Site Liaison to support the apprenticeship site staff, provide subject matter expertise and consultation to the project, and ensure that all deliverables are met to achieve the goals of the project.
