This is an extension of the Career Grow Chicago program that was started in September of 2022.

This new grant is a combination of rollover funds from the Sept 1, 2022 - December 31, 2024 grant period and additional funds to support the work through December 31, 2025. DFSS will continue to partner with CCC to address the needs of today's workforce through expansion of apprenticeships and work-based learning training programs. The goal of these programs is to provide resources and access to short-term training certifications, work-based learning experiences and apprenticeships that will enable up to 3,614 Chicago residents from September 1, 2022 through December 31, 2024 (now extended to December 31, 2025) to earn an average hourly rate of \$15-\$30 during their onthe-job training experiences that will in-turn prepare participants to obtain employment sooner while putting them on a path to earn increased sustainable wages long term.

This project will support an innovative transfer pathways and degree planning program that will support students in their quest for bachelor's degree completion by allowing them to start on pathways at Chicago Public Schools, transfer to complete an associate degree at CCC, and transfer to University of Illinois Chicago as junior in program of study with zero credit loss. An anonymous private funder provided this pass through to the City Colleges of Chicago Foundation.

This is a renewal grant from the New America Foundation. Career Launch Chicago will expand career exploration opportunities through a tiered engagement model prioritizing schools with limited prior work-based learning

exposure. The initiative will implement 25 sector-specific Makerspaces across IT, Healthcare, Manufacturing, and Construction industries while coordinating 10 Facility Tours with Job Shadow opportunities for immersive industry experiences. A data-driven apprentice development system will be established through monthly reflection forms, staff training on data analysis, and quarterly review processes to identify trends and improvement opportunities. To enhance institutional alignment, working groups with City Colleges department chairs will design apprenticeship cohort models, align on-the-job training with classroom instruction, and develop frameworks for awarding college credit for workplace learning. The program will develop new pathways within existing sectors by identifying emerging specializations, defining competency requirements with employer partners, and designing curriculum frameworks for specialized career tracks. Employer capacity will be strengthened through quarterly workshops on youth mentorship and inclusive practices, facilitated peer learning communities, and improved methods for tracking retention and completion metrics. Progress will be monitored through employer feedback mechanisms and a quarterly dashboard measuring progress against strategic growth goals.
