The grant was awarded through the Searle Funds at The Chicago Community Trust, helping to connect more Chicago residents to quality jobs and long-term economic mobility while supporting employers’ talent development goals. The Per Capita allocations are referred to as “Tuition,” funded by Chicago Public Schools and the amount is determined by “tuition per seat.” Truman Middle College (TMC) currently holds 178 seats at an allocation of \$12,800 per student. This grant provides support for TMC’s entire operational costs: administrative, instructional, and support staff costs. This grant also provides assistance for instructional supplies, professional development, student activities, and dual enrollment.

reduces financial barriers through tuition assistance, book stipends, and additional allowances for academic and career-related expenses. Grant funds also support instructional resources, career readiness programming, and job placement activities designed to improve completion rates, strengthen employment outcomes, and support participants in securing competitive wages.

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Workforce Empowerment Initiative (WEI) aims to expand access for learners who have traditionally been excluded from workforce opportunities, faced limited pathways to postsecondary education or career advancement, and have been systematically underrepresented in high demand and high wage industries. With these awarded funds, Wilbur Wright College will lead the Workforce Empowerment Initiative Collaborative (WEI-C) with partner Harold Washington College to provide individuals with support and education to attain a college and industry credentials. The WEI-C will prioritize funding to serve students from the communities of Austin, North and South Lawndale, Humboldt Park East and West

Garfield Park, Washington Park, Englewood, and South Chicago. The WEI-C will continue its ambitious program containing credentialing programs with career pathways for the students served on the grant in FY27. The target population will be residents from the city of Chicago, who are adults aged 18 and over and individuals residing in Disproportionately Impacted Areas. Each college will use \$500,000.00 from the grant award to support and serve students from targeted underserved community areas to provide an opportunity toward economic mobility through short-term, less than one year in-demand career pathways. The Partners in Education (PIE) Program provides access to various degree and certificate programs, educational services for adults with lower literacy skills, and support services to prepare them for careers in growing or sustainable industries. The program covers all unmet costs after financial aid is applied; costs are paid through non-transferable CCC vouchers for use at registration and the online bookstore. This is an amendment to extend the original agreement, July 1st, 2024-June 30th, 2025 to July 1st, 2026 - June 30th, 2027. The amendment also increased additional compensation amount of \$800,000.00 resulting in aggregate not to exceed compensation amount of \$3,200,000.00

This two-year renewal grant is for Education Workforce Center (EWC) at Harry S Truman College will allow for recruitment and retention of Education professionals to be focus. A collaborative partnership with various partners and stakeholders will help EWC support work to ensure vacancies are filled and current staff retain their positions through utilization of services, including the EWC job portal. Career exploration and job placement services geared specifically for Education professionals and directly linked to college and university programs for education across grade band, beginning with early childhood, will allow for the transition from student to professional phase to be more seamless and increase job security in vacant roles across Chicago.

Building on the planning and relationship development established during Phase I, this project seeks to strengthen the transfer experience through coordinated supports and intentional collaboration between the sending and receiving

institutions. CCC's concept is to create a more seamless and student-centered transfer pathway between Truman College and NLU.
