that the Wilbur Wright College Career Programs Office sponsored its third annual Career Development Month in February 2004. The theme for this year was "Career Tech...The Path to Success"; and

a specific occupational group was focused on weekly: Criminal Justice/Law Enforcement, Health Careers, Education, and Engineering, Science, & Technology. Speakers, an information table, and presentations were scheduled to deliver general & career development information as well as college program information, labor market information, and employment opportunities. Several outside agencies participated, i.e. Chicago Police Department, New Moms, Inc. U.S. Army, and recruitment agencies. Weekly mini college fairs were hosted, with representatives from local colleges and universities. Several departments (Student Academic Success Center, Transfer Center, and Job Placement) and college campus organizations (Future Teachers of Chicago and Society of Hispanic Professional Engineers (SHPE) provided important information and organizational assistance. Information Systems Security Association (ISSA) held its Chapter Meeting on campus and provided a platform to showcase the College's Computer Security and Forensic Investigation (CSFI) program; and

for the fourth year the Career Development Month culminated with a Guaranteed 4.0 Learning Seminar presented by Donna Johnson, founder and presenter of the system. This system guarantees students a 4.0 Grade Point Average if they follow the plan. All events were well attended and offered invaluable information to our students for academic achievement and employment.
