> Model Airplane Flying Contest Wilbur Wright College

REPORTS:

that on Saturday, December 13, 2003, a Model Airplane Flying Contest was held at Wilbur Wright College as part of the Centennial Anniversary Commemoration of the Wright Brothers' First Flight.

Event sponsors were the Chicago Centennial of Flight Commission, the City of Chicago's Department of Aviation, the Federal Aviation Administration of the Great Lakes Region, and Wright College. Students were invited to form teams to research, design, and construct an original rubber band powered model aircraft, and fly their rubber band powered model exactly 120 feet in straight and level flight; 120 feet was the length of the Wright Brothers original, 1903 flight; the aircraft model was to take off on its own power from a level surface, indoors under no wind conditions. Students competed for prizes and were awarded in four categories – 6th-8th grade, 9th-10th grade, 11th -12th grade, and community college/university level.

Altgeld School was awarded a third place prize; second place prizes were awarded to Pennoyer Elementary School; and to Wright College (representing the college/university level); first place prizes were awarded to Pilgrim Lutheran, Pennoyer Elementary, Nicholas Senn High School, and to Wright College's Society of Hispanic Engineers members.
