NEW PROPOSALS OR GRANTS

TANF/Low Income Degree Program (PD# 040102)

The District Office has received funding of \$225,000 from the University of Illinois at Springfield from a project funded by the Illinois Department of Human Services to provide scholarships to eligible students in the TANF/Low Income Scholarship Project. In addition, the award will provide \$17,500 in administrative fees for a total of \$242,000. The performance period for this subcontract will be from January 1, 2004 through June 30, 2004.

Professional Development Seminar Series (PD# 040104)

The District Office has submitted a proposal to the Joyce Foundation of Chicago for a grant of \$400,000 for a two year project which will offer professional development seminars for City College faculty in the areas of child development, early childhood education, and adult education. The performance period for the two year project is from May 1, 2004 through April 30, 2006.

Substance Abuse Prevention (PD# 040105)

Malcolm X College has been awarded \$5,000 by the Illinois Higher Education Center for Alcohol, Other Drug and Violence Prevention (IHEC), utilizing funding from the Illinois Department of Human Services, Bureau of Substance Abuse Prevention. Funds will be utilized to assess current needs and potential funding sources in the area of substance abuse prevention. The performance period for this project is from November 14, 2003 through June 30, 2004.

CSFI Chicago (PD# 040106)

Wright College has received a grant for \$3,000 from the Illinois State Library, FY 2004 Library Services and Technology Act. Funds will be used to purchase library materials for Computer Security and Forensic Investigation (CSFI). The performance period for this project is from October 8, 2003 through June 30, 2004.

Being Loved, Being Unloved (PD# 040107)

Wright College has received a grant for \$3,000 from the Illinois State Library, FY 2004 Library Services and Technology Act. Funds will be used to purchase library materials for Wright's *Great Books* Program. The performance period for this project is from October 8, 2003 through June 30, 2004.

Empowerment Zone (PD# 040109)

The District Office has been awarded \$120,000 by the Chicago Empowerment Office to implement a new curriculum for building trades and construction industries. The performance period for this project is from June 23, 2003 through June 30, 2004.

CONTINUATION AWARDS

Head Start / Child Care Collaboration (PD# 040101)

The District Office has received funding for \$1,005,236 from the Chicago Department of Human Services to provide Head Start and Child Care Day and Nighttime collaborative services for children of low income parents at the Dawson, Kennedy-King, Malcolm X and Olive-Harvey Child Development Centers. The performance period for the project is from December 1, 2003 to November 30, 2004.

Citigroup Impact Grant (PD#040103)

The Citigroup Foundation has awarded the City Colleges of Chicago a new grant of \$15,000, from its Impact Grant Program, to use for student tuition and fees for the Professional Bank Teller Training Program. The funds, received in November, 2002, are available until fully expended.

Youth Skills Development and Training Project (PD# 040108)

The District Office has submitted a proposal for \$101,211 to the Alternative Schools Network to support training and development activities at the Olive-Harvey Middle College alternative high school. The period of performance for the project is from July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2004.

AMENDMENTS

Adult Education and Family Literacy (PD# 030610)

The District Office has received funding of \$13,304,140 for its adult education and family literacy projects by the Illinois Community College Board. The program supports training activities including adult literacy, ABE, GED, and family literacy. The performance period for the funding is from July 1, 2003 through June 30, 2004. The award includes funding for subcontracts to:

21st Century Urban Schools for \$50,000 Logan Square Neighborhood Association for \$160,000

President's Scholarship Foundation Donation (PD# 040106)

Malcolm X College has received a donation of \$2,500 from the Tom Joyner Foundation, Inc., for the President's Scholarship Fund to assist deserving students to continue their educational endeavors at the College.
