that a joint training and development program between Malcolm X College and Chicago State University, the **Future Faculty Internship Program (FFIP)** was officially launched in the spring of 2003. The **Future Faculty Internship Program (FFIP)** is designed to assist qualified graduate students of underrepresented status gain access to tenure-track teaching positions at the community college level. The program, open to CSU graduate students who have completed at least 50% of their program, helps recipients develop an understanding of the skills associated with the profession by interning with a community college faculty member. During the semester, FFIP interns learned the following skilled-based competencies:

- Assessing student work, course syllabi, and course planning.
- Received hands-on training from industry professionals.
- Acquire state-of-the-art technological skills
- Gained classroom experience with tenured faculty in the discipline.
